They just help me weave my web.*

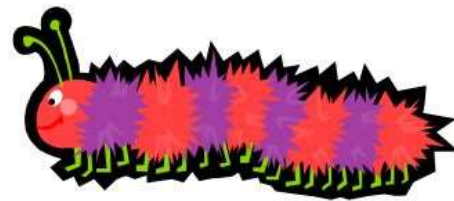
Ants on the Ground

When the days are sunny.

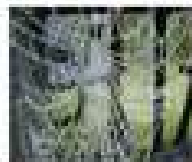


Winging, flinging, dancing, springing
